4 SEARCH WARRANT

5 THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA
6 To any Sheriff. Constable. Marshal. Policeman or Peace Officer in
7 the County of Santa Clara:

8 Proof, by affidavit, having been made before me this day by
9 OFFICER BUCKY HARRIS that there is probable cause for believing
10 that evidence of the commission of felonies. to wit: violations
11 of CALIFORNIA PENAL CODE SECTIONS 266j (CHILD PANDERING) (3
12 COUNTS). more particularly described below and property used in
13 the commission of these felonies will be located on the premises
14 described below.

15 YOU ARE THEREFORE COMMANDED, in the daytime, to make search of
16 XXX XXXXXXXX XXXXX, SAN JOSE, SANTA CLARA COUNTY, California,
17 which premises consist of: a single-story family residence; light
18 brown in color with dark brown trim with a dark brown roof with
19 the numbers XXX affixed to the dark brown trim on the left side of
20 the garage door and any garage and incidental storage
21 compartments, lockers, sheds and areas adjacent to said dwelling;

22 AND a vehicle described as A 1980 Dodge Detomaso. 2 door and
23 yellow and black in color. with California License No. 1LYL821,
24 wherever located in Santa Clara County. California;

1. Photos, films, negatives, slides, video tapes, movies, books, magazines, newspapers, flyers, and advertisements depicting, showing and representing children and/or adults and/or animals engaging in sexual conduct, including, but not limited to, sexual conduct as defined in California Penal Code §311.4(d);
2. Commercial magazines which depict the acts described in number one, above, involving minors under seventeen years of age;
3. Any undeveloped rolls of film, negatives or transparencies which may contain minors posing in the nude or posing in explicit sexual acts with minors or adults as set forth in number one above;
4. Non-sexual photographs of minors with whom the suspect may have had contacts;
5. Information leading to the identity and age of the minor children depicted in the photographs described above;
6. Cameras, lenses, camera accessories including but not limited to lights, reflectors, tripods, stands, backdrops, film both exposed and not exposed, negatives, slides, photo processing equipment, chemicals for processing film, print paper, filters, enlargers, mounting devices and materials, film projection equipment, screens, viewers, video tape cameras, video tapes, video cassettes, video recordings and darkroom implements and supplies; receipts, records, manuals and instruction material evidencing purchase, ownership and/or possession of the items described in this paragraph;
7. Receipts or other records indicating the processing or developing of film set forth above;
8. Sexual aids including, but not limited to, dildos, vibrators and stimulating lotions;
9. Books, manuals, and other material that could be used for training and instruction in posing, modeling and performing live or on film, nude or partially or fully clothed, childrens' clothing, girls' and womens' lingerie, nightgowns, underwear and swimwear;

10. Writings, including, but not limited to diaries, ledgers, letters, tapes, or any other type of correspondence which describe the acts set forth in number one above; and

11. Computer equipment including, but not limited to, central processing units, monitors, keyboards, hard disks, diskettes, printers, printer paper, electrical/ connecting cords, and computer generated digitizing equipment;

12. Computer generated printouts;

13. Evidence of occupancy including, but not limited to, checks, cancelled mail, envelopes, utility bills, or personal correspondence;

14. And articles of personal property tending to establish the identity of persons in control of the premises being searched including rent receipts, utility company receipts, and addressed mail;

15. Evidence tending to identify the location and true identity of victims in the state of Washington;

16. Evidence tending to confirm the identity of children with whom the suspect has contact but may not be depicted in photographs;

17. Phone bills;


And if you find the same or any part thereof, to hold such property in your possession under California Penal Code Section 1536, or to release the property to the appropriate agency for state or federal forfeiture proceedings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the affidavit in support of the search warrant regarding the above-entitled case, shall be and are
